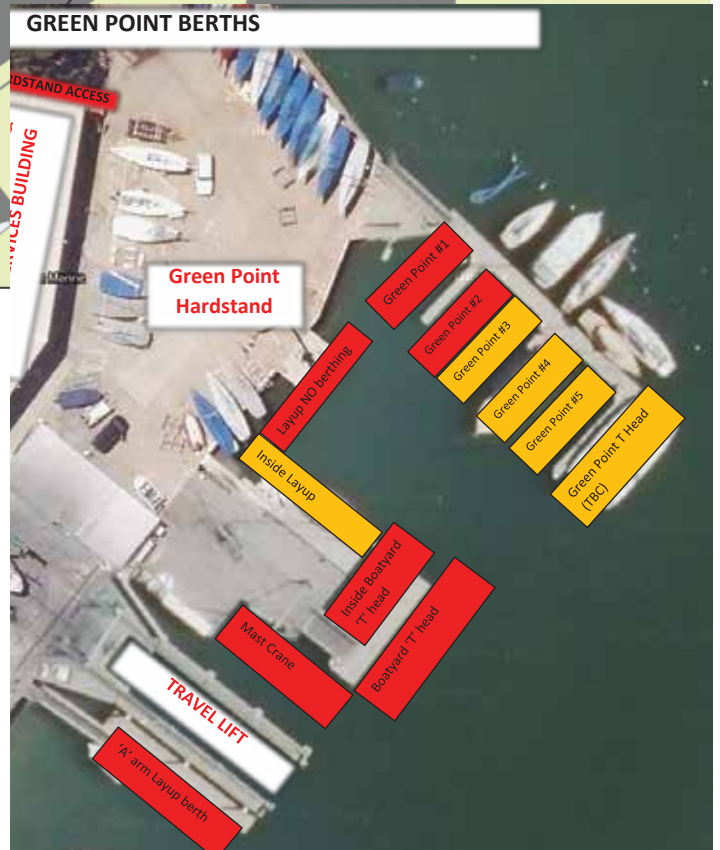
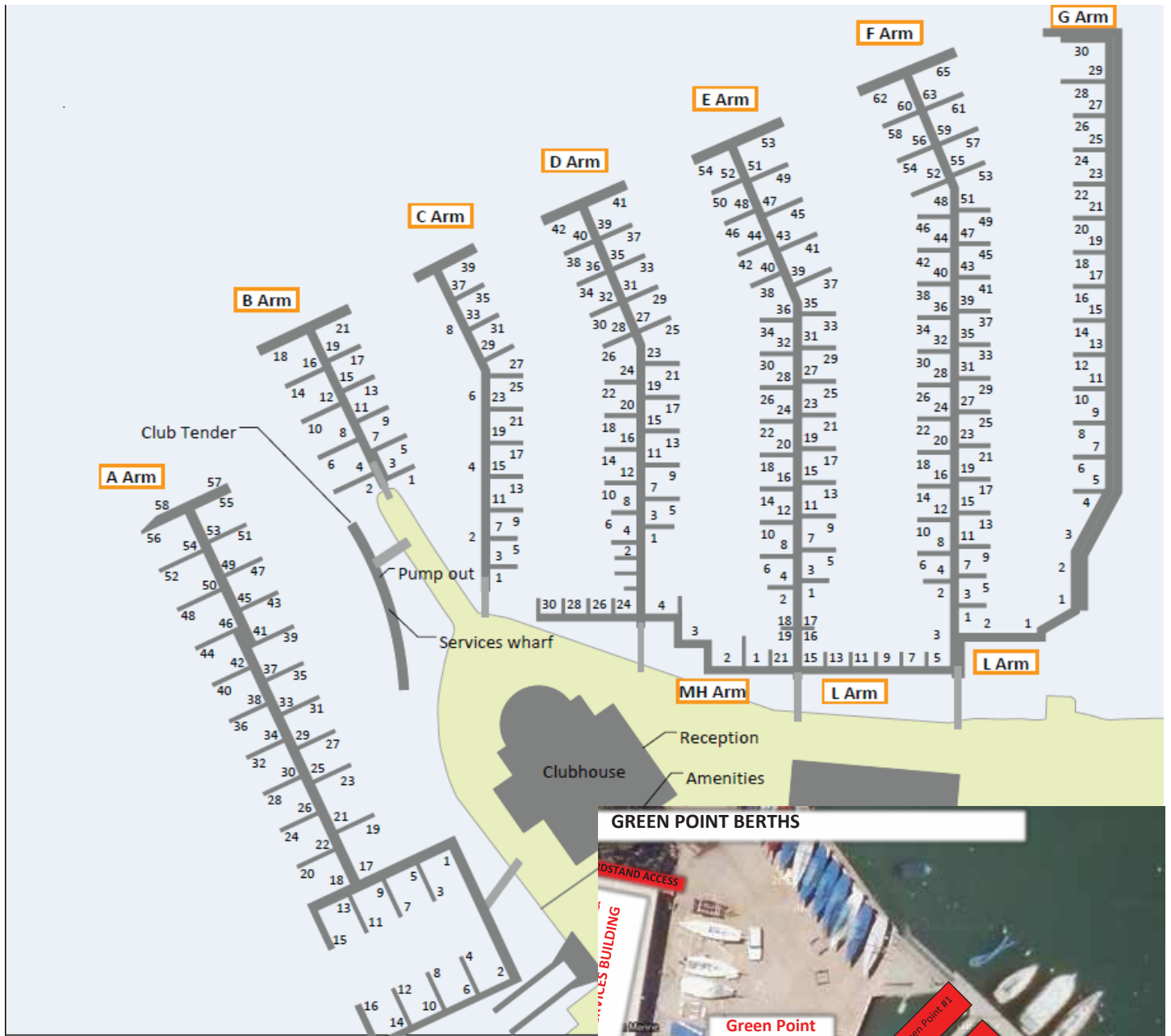

# WEATHER

## An update from Roger Badham

### SITUATION

*As at Tuesday 16 April*

High pressure over the southern Tasman Sea and a trough offshore from the NSW north coast.

The ridge is close to central coast – in the area where the NE winds on the south coast shift to SE on the north coast.

Some showers with the SE winds on the north coast and this morning there are a few showers running onto the coast south of Norah Head and more frequent showers north of Newcastle and north of there.

Wind today will be mostly SE turning to the E-NE this evening and tonight.

Tomorrow will be similar, but faster during the day to shift left from SE to NE.

Thursday should have NE breezes all day while Friday will see a weak S change with a few more showers.

Saturday will see the SE-NE shift and Sunday NE-N.

Monday also NW-NE ahead of a S change sometime Monday night.

### FORECAST

**Wind is for exposed areas, inside waters will have less breeze in the afternoons.**

**Seas are for the near ocean areas and not the inside protected waters.**

#### Tuesday 16

WIND SW-SE/8-12 shift SE-NE later tonight and tonight  
SEAS 0.9m from SE  
WEATHER partly cloudy with a shower or 2 – mostly dry; 23C

#### Wednesday 17

WIND SE-E-NE/8-12  
SEAS 1m from E  
WEATHER partly cloudy - early shower, then dry; 23C

#### Thursday 18

WIND W-NW then E-NE/10-15  
SEAS 1m from ENE  
WEATHER fairly sunny; 24-25C

#### Friday 19

WIND S-SE/10-15  
SEAS 1.2m from ENE  
WEATHER partly cloudy – few showers developing; 24C

#### Saturday 20

WIND SW-SE/8-12 then E-NE/9-13  
SEAS 1.2m from ENE  
WEATHER sun/cloud with a shower or 2 but mostly dry; 24C

#### Sunday 21

WIND NW then N-NNE/2-16  
SEAS 1.2m from ENE  
WEATHER sun/cloud – early shower then mostly dry
