Inshore Race 2 Report

After a balmy layday, notable for a paddle board regatta, wind power returned for the second inshore race. In a variable ten knot SE breeze, three divisions started the Course 1 race in two tight groups. The northern edge of the channel appeared to be the better side for pressure and Ishtar went to a solid lead. The Cruise Captain went to the masthead to look for Hellrazer astern, which had apparently set a double reefed main (no doubt in anticipation of Thursday's forecast).

Ishtar led the division at the first mark and maintained that position throughout. ToyBox at times closed to within a boatlength. However, clever tactical sailing by Ishtar protected her lead. Tula should be thanked by ToyBox for trying to push Ishtar up in the last 500 metres.

Given the forecast of a Southerly blow due on Thursday, today unfortunately may have been the last race of the Cruise. With the wonderful weather so far it is difficult to be too despondent about a shortened regatta.

History of a name, Little Shark Rock Point

A point we've all passed by possibly without noticing, Little Shark Rock Point, is located between two unnamed bays east of the entrance to Jerusalem Bay. It is sometimes known as Newcastle Point because of the wharf that was built there by the Newcastle and Hunter River Steamship Co. in the late 1890s. The company was granted a lease on the point on 12 December 1893 so that excursions could land during day trips from Sydney. Sharks were plentiful in Cowan Creek and Broken Bay up until the 1950s. A local in the early times, Gordon Windybank, said "At Shark Rock near Jerusalem Bay there were that many damn sharks, there were schools of them."
